

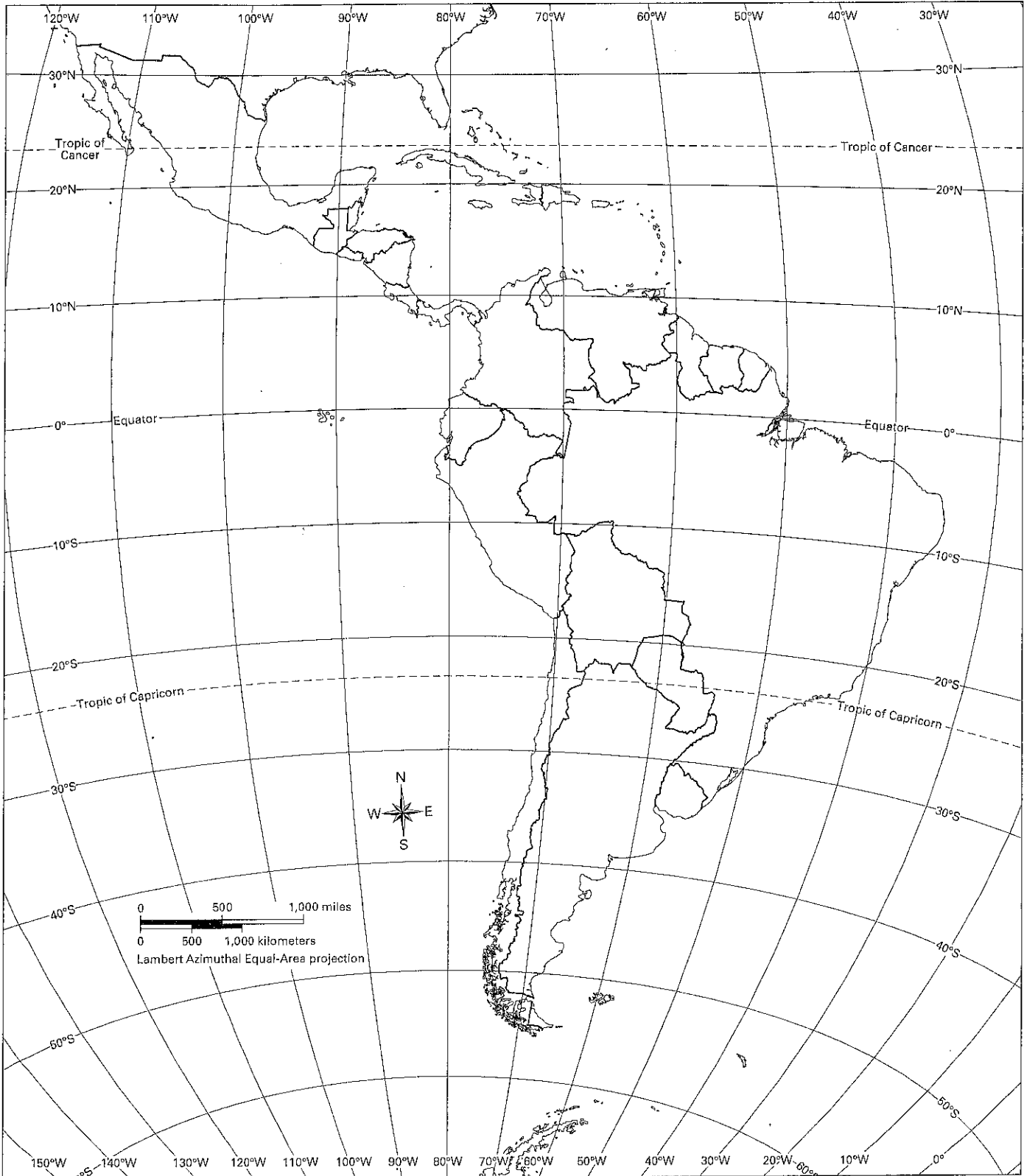
## Learning About the Human Geography of Latin America
