



Navy Restrictions

1. Wear comfortable clothing: Polo or T-shirts with jeans or shorts. Tennis/running or flat, rubber soled shoes. Do not wear heels, sandals or flip-flops. Do not wear necklaces that can get caught and bags that will be too heavy to comfortably carry all day. Ladies should not wear skirts as guests will be climbing ladders.
2. If you are bringing a handbag or camera case, it will be searched prior to entering any ship. Remember to bring sunscreen and/or sunglasses; it is going to be warm/sunny.
3. No large backpacks, pocket knives, weapons or containers of liquid of any kind (including bottled water) will be allowed aboard. Bottled water will be available for purchase on the pier.
4. Electronic devices are subject to examination for functionality. All visitors will pass through a magnetometer and may be searched as necessary to determine source of metal. All adults 18 and over must have a valid state issued I.D. card with a photo.
5. Wheelchairs are allowed on the pier, but not able to access the ships.
6. Strollers will not be allowed on any ships.
7. Cameras (still and video) are permitted during the tour.
8. The U.S. Navy is not responsible for any personal articles or property lost or stolen while left unattended on the pier.






Stairs on ships have open treads and are steeper than regular stairs.



Doorways are raised and can be tripping hazards.



Wear comfortable clothes (pants recommended), closed-toed shoes, and walk down ladders backward.

This allows you to see where you are stepping and for the entire foot to fit on each step.



Flip-flops and sandals can lead to stubbed toes or fall off when climbing ladders. Skirts can be awkward or dangerous on ladders.

It is not recommended to go down ladders forward as you cannot see where you are going and your foot may slip off the edge of the stair.

What to Wear



What to Bring



If over 18
